SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Washougal High School is located in a picturesque setting at the “Gateway to the Gorge” serving over 1,000 students in a town with approximately 15,000 residences. Students are instructed by 54 certified and 42 classified staff members. Academically prepared, today’s Washougal graduates pursue post-secondary education and employment in the Northwest as well as across the globe. Our contemporary campus thrives on pride and tradition in the community.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Washougal High School offers a wide variety of courses in Career and Technical Education, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, English, Foreign Languages, Physical Education, and Fine Arts. Students interested in pursuing college credit may participate in WHS’ AP program, College in the High School, the CTE Dual credit programs, and/or attend Clark College through the Running Start program. In addition, Washougal High School is a partner with the Clark County Cascadia Tech Academy consortium for students interested in pursuing training in technical career areas.

Classes are taught by a talented and experienced corps of teachers where nearly 70 percent of the staff have a master’s degree or higher and average twelve years of teaching.

Grading System: WHS uses a letter grading system based on a 4.0 scale. A student’s grade point average (GPA) is based on the average of all semester letter grades D or higher.

Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory or Credit/No Credit grades are not included in the GPA calculation. WHS does not weight any classes.
