





2021-22 compared with 2022-23






Outperforming the State

Washougal students outperformed the state average in 82% of the subjects and grades tested (14 out of 17).



Teacher Collaboration

The Science team at CCMS outperformed the state average of 43% by 31 percentage points.



ELA Elementary Success

Hathaway saw a yearto-year increase of 27 percentage points in 3rd grade ELA scores.



Overall Improvement

Washougal saw year-toyear improvement in 70% of the subjects and grades tested.




Disaggregated data SBA Spring 2023







Educational Engagement

- Outreach to Booster and community groups and inviting two way communication
- Sharing student stories via Mary's Monday Minute, social media, and website
- Tracking student engagement with fine arts, athletics, and other programs, and identifying areas to grow to match student interest
- Increasing access by including fifth grade band in the school day, and adding athletic opportunities for sixth grade students
- Grade 9-12 participation in athletics grew from 34.9% in 2020-21 to 43.3% in 2022-23. When we include after school clubs, pep band and drama, the percentage of students is <u>51.4%</u>








EDUCATIONAL ENGAGEMENT




Consistent, Reliable and Predictable Fiscal Processes

- Build understanding of the budget process and provide opportunities for community input






STEWARDSHIP OF RESOURCES

2022-23* is estimated ending Fund Balance and **2023-24 through 2026-27 is budgeted ending Fund Balance


