



## STATE ASSESSMENT RESULTS

## OUTPERFORMING THE STATE

Washougal students outperformed the state average in 82% of the subjects and grades tested (14 out of 17).



## ELA ELEMENTARY SUCCESS

Hathaway saw a yearto-year increase of 27 percentage points in 3rd grade ELA scores.



## TEACHER COLLABORATION

The Science team at CCMS outperformed the state average of 43% by 31 percentage points.



## OVERALL IMPROVEMENT

Washougal saw yearto-year improvement in 70% of the subjects and grades tested.
